Improving Parks and Recreation Centers Across District 9

Since being elected in 2013, Councilmember Curren Price has helped secure more than \$60 million to make improvements across every park and recreation center in District 9. Under his leadership, a wide variety of improvements and repairs have been made in CD 9 including; new playground equipment, outdoor fitness equipment, basketball courts, skate parks, play fields, lighting, security cameras and much more.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS

■ Gilbert Lindsay Recreation Center

Celebrated the installation of a Dodger Dreamfield over the summer. Enhancements include a field makeover, shade structures, new fencing, new bullpens, a solar scoreboard, sprinkler system upgrade, and the addition of a concrete path and ADA accessible bleachers.

■ Trinity Skate Park

Located on the south side of the Trinity Recreation Center, District 9 welcomed its second world-class skatepark in the fall. The installation of this 3,000 square-foot skatepark includes additional upgrades to the landscaping, benches, security cameras and fencing around the park and the soccer field.

COMING SOON

■ Bill Greene Memorial Park

An approximately 20,000 square-foot Department of Water and Power parcel located at Figueroa Street and Slauson Avenue sat idle for more than 60 years. Councilmember Price secured \$3.6 million to transform the empty lot into a new park that will include a community amphitheater, beautiful landscaping and self-cleaning restrooms, adding green space to the South LA community. The park will be named in honor of the late State Sen. Bill Greene who served as Democratic member of the California State Assembly and the California State Senate, representing South Los Angeles for more than 25 years.



■ Green Meadows Recreation Center

Councilmember Price played a crucial role in obtaining a \$7 million grant from the State of California through Proposition 68 to benefit Green Meadows Recreation Center. Future improvements will include a modernized recreation center, renovation of the baseball field, two basketball courts, a new children's playground, an outdoor fitness area and so much more. Construction is expected to begin in 2022 with most improvements completed within a year.

■ Inell Woods Park

Located at 87th Street and McKinley Avenue, this future community pocket park is named after the late Inell Woods, a long-time resident and community champion for District 9. This 16,000 square-foot park will include a walking trail, exercise equipment, California native landscaping, picnic tables and seating areas. Councilmember Price was instrumental in securing over \$1.5 million in funding for the development of this neighborhood park.

■ Ross Snyder Recreation Center

Councilmember Price was able to secure \$1 million to build District 9's first dog park at Ross Snyder Recreation Center. Additional improvements that are being spearheaded by the Council Office will include the replacement of an aging soccer field, universally accessible playground equipment for children of all abilities, new trees, security cameras, new lighting and more.
